Workshop Internationalisation at Home (IaH)

**What is it?**

IaH is understood in many different ways. It is a broad concept not easy to define.

Wachter (1) defined it as *...any internationally related activity with the exception of outbound student and staff mobility.*

It means that IaH touches upon everyone, not only those who are mobiles- and everything in Higher Education Institutions.

Beelen and Jones (2) introduced a more focused definition *IaH is the purposeful integration of internationalisation and intercultural dimensions into the formal and informal curriculum for all students within domestic learning environments.*

**What is expected?**

This workshop aims to share good practices of IaH.

Formal and non-formal academic curriculum, cooperation local/international students, intercultural competences, internationalised learning outcomes and assessment innovative uses for digital technology.
